LEARNING & SUPPORT



Glossodia Public school places a great importance on Learning and Support, and has a comprehensive learning and support program run by our Learning and Support Teachers, and School Learning Support Officers. Students who are identified as needing some more assistance or practise in a particular key learning area, are supported through one of our various programs. Students may be supported by one of the programs run in small groups, individually or as part of a small group in the classroom.

Our processes are continually reviewed and refined, as we strive to ensure that all students get the support they require, based on meaningful assessments and observations. Learning support is targeted and tailored to meet specific student needs and is a very positive experience.

At Glossodia, we run excellent programs to support the academic needs of our students, but also through the introduction of the Confident Kids program, we are able to run programs to improve the social and emotional wellbeing of students. This program focuses on building skills in social emotional learning, including building and maintaining friendships and recognising and dealing more effectively with feelings. It works on building both problem solving strategies and decision making strategies for the students. The program aims to support our students in their learning environment and in the home environment and has great success in this area in past Terms. We appreciate your support and positive encouragement, working in partnership to ensure the best possible student learning outcomes, and the holistic wellbeing of our students.



GLOSSODIA PUBLIC SCHOOL'S CONFIDENT KIDS PROGRAM



As part of our PDHPE program our school is running a successful program called 'Confident Kids'. This program is aimed at our K-2 students and focuses on developing the children's social and emotional skills. The students are taught emotional resilience, problem solving and social skills, which better equip them to manage various social and emotional situations that arise in childhood and beyond.

AUTOMATED GATES



After nearly a year of negotiations with the School Security Unit, our automated gates are finally in operation. All gates at the front of the school are automated and have a backup battery in case of a power shortage. To make sure we can always use our gates, we also have a specific key that can be used to manually open the gates if needed. Yesterday, all students met Mrs Curtis at the gates to observe safety rules when gates are in use. The warning buzzer will warn pedestrians that gates are opening and closing, while the safety lasers will detect any movement that may be deemed unsafe and therefore stop the gate immediately. Even though we have all these safety measures in place, it is important that everyone is patient while gates are opening and closing, so please wait until they are fully open or closed before approaching.



MOSQUITOS

This time of year is mosquito season. As a school we have made sure that every classroom has a plug in mosquito repellent and a safe mosquito repellent that teachers can apply to student's arms and legs if needed. It would be a good idea to ensure that you apply sunscreen and mosquito repellent before they come to school, to help avoid bites and irritation. Please contact the front office if your child is allergic to mosquito repellent to make sure that we **DO NOT** apply it to them. A note was sent home yesterday for you to read and return the permission note.

2021 STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAYS



Every year the NSW Department of Education allocates 4 days where teachers engage in a range of professional learning that will help them keep up to date with current policies, curriculum and educational strategies, that support student outcomes and wellbeing.

Next year 2 of those days will be in Term 1, another in Term 2 and the last one in Term 3. In the past, 2 days were scheduled for the last 2 days of Term 4. Most schools organise professional learning over a number of days throughout the year in lieu of those last 2 days. The reason for this is that by the time we get to the end of the year, teachers have indicated that the amount of work they retain when they are exhausted, is very minimal.

This means that the first day of school for all **Year 1-6 students** will be on **Friday 29 January 2021**. **Kindergarten students** will have their Best Start interviews on **Friday 29 January, Monday 1 February and Tuesday 2 February**. Their first official school day will be on **Wednesday 3 February**.

We would also like to remind everyone that if COVID rules are relaxed, parents will be allowed on site for the first 5 weeks of Term 1. From Week 6 onwards, parents will kiss their children good bye at the front gates. This is to help all students settle in quickly, build resilience, build friendships by playing with newly found friends and develop independence.

Mrs Curtis will be at the front gate greeting students with a smile. We promise that all students will be fine. They do a great job when you are at home and we are confident they can do it, with your support at the start of each day.

When the school day ends, you will be able to greet them with a smile and a hug at the side gate, which is the same gate we are using now.

HOT WEATHER

During extreme hot weather we will be cancelling all physical activities, including play at lunch time and recess. Students will be directed to the COLA or the hall, where they will be supervised in a shaded area. Please speak to your children about this so they understand that we have a duty of care in all extreme weather conditions, including the heat.

Preparation is underway for 2021. We all have our fingers crossed that we can hold 9 classes, which as you know will be of great benefit to both the school and the students.

A lot of time is put into forming classes. We consider academic ability, learning styles, support and friendships. Sometimes, students and parents are concerned that their child is not in the same class as all their friends. While we will make every effort to ensure that all our students start the year off with as much confidence as possible, it is important that you are aware of the professional conversations that take place before finalising classes. We always aim to have a least one friend for each student in each class.

However, it is important to remember that whilst it is very important that all students are happy, it is equally important that they are in a class where we feel they will be challenged and given the opportunity to achieve their best. If we feel that some friendships will hinder a child's academic potential, we will not be placing them in the same class.

If we can hold 9 classes there will be many opportunities for all students in the same grade to learn some key Learning Areas with students in other classes. We are working on some exciting new opportunities for all our students, which I am sure they will all enjoy and benefit from.

In order for your children to be prepared for what is to come, I ask that you start talking to them about the possibility of not getting the teacher they were hoping for, or being in a class with all their friends. Reassure them that they will see all their friends before school, at lunch, recess and during sport activities, at the very least.

Together, we can eliminate any unnecessary anxiety, by positively talking to them about school and how it is a place of learning and fun, not fun and learning.

Please trust that we will make professional decisions that we know will help your child reach their full potential.

P&C Meeting November 3 2020

Term 4 has started off well with all students back and ready to learn. COVID guidelines have still had an impact on the various activities that we can do however, overall we have done extremely well as a school community to adapt and deal with these changes. In fact staff have noticed a huge improvement in resilience, problem solving and more importantly self-confidence and independence. Because of this, from 2021 regardless of COVID guidelines I will be allowing parent onsite in Term 1 for 5 weeks (if COVID rules are lifted) and from then on, parents will be asked to drop off and pick up students at the gates.

Of course when guidelines change parents will be welcomed with open arms during those special moments/events that we all want to share with our students, your children.

As usual, we have been busy teaching and learning with some exciting changes coming next year. As you know the September/October holidays was a busy time for our GA and another wonderful GA, who we hired from Hawkesbury HS.

Gardens have been mulched and excess rubbish removed from all areas of the school. In term 3 & 4 we spent a total of around \$60 000 upgrading parts of our school. The breakdown is as follows:

Yarning Circle: \$ 8,350 Complete

Chessboard: \$4,225 Complete

Hand dryers: \$5,500 Complete

Gates: \$36,000 Week 6

Netball Court: \$14,000 Week?

We are hoping to form 9 classes next year. With just 4 more students that will be possible. A new planning cycle is underway and we have been analysing data that will help guide our pedagogy next year.

With additional support in classroom to target individual needs, we know that we can continue making great gains both academically and emotionally for all our students.

One area I will be focusing on is parent engagement. Research shows that students who have a strong and positive support network at home, are more likely to succeed in the future no matter their goal. I hope that the P&C will continue working closely with the school to build positive academic partnerships that will shape the foundations for all our students to be life - long learners and great global citizens.

Our first small group of 2021 kindergarten students visited us today with great success and we can't wait to meet them all.

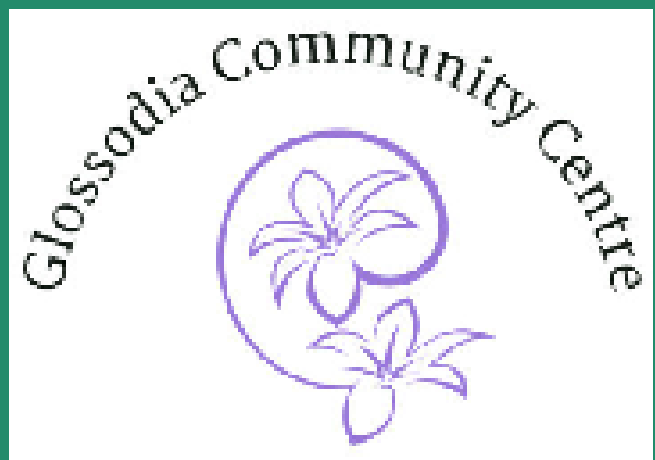

iPhone / iPad iOS

Installing

1. From your mobile device go to the **App Store** search for **School Stream**
2. Tap the **FREE** button to the right of the School Stream listing
3. Tap the **INSTALL** button
4. Enter your Apple ID and password & tap **OK**
5. Wait for the install icon to change to **OPEN**
6. Tap the **OPEN** button
7. You will be prompted to accept push notifications, you will need to select **OK**
8. Start typing your **school name** into the search then **SELECT** your school

Deleting

1. From your device press and **hold down** the **School Stream** icon until the icon begins to jiggle.
2. Tap the little **x** in the upper-left corner of the School Stream app. (A dialog appears, informing you that deleting this app also deletes all its data).
3. Tap the **Delete** button.

Android/Tablet
