


Communication and Community Minister Writing Recognition Award



Education News

Maths is very useful in everyday life. Maths can help us do many things that are important in our everyday lives. Here are some daily tasks for which maths is important:

Our school lunch break is the busiest for them, Mrs Finlay and me, as teachers and students use this time for meetings, support or assistance with a variety of tasks. Our lunch break is usually taken when things slow around 2:30pm. To ensure everyone has time to eat, drink and have a break, I would like to ask that you try not to call the office between 12:45 and 1:30 if your call is not urgent, so that we have time to recharge.

Of course, if it is urgent, please make contact, because we will always address any emergency immediately.

Stage 2 Camp

Further information will be sent to students once you have secured your child's spot. Mrs Sutherland Ready and Mr Corr will both be attending camp. Make sure you start organising the necessities to spread the cost of items over the term. This will help keep your budget in check.

Stage 3 Camp



Stage 3 students can participate in our excursion to Canberra staying 2 nights at Canberra Park. Mrs Buckingham and Mr Eldridge will be accompanying the students. Whilst in Canberra, students will visit Parliament House with a tour of The Senate, House of Representatives and The Parliament Education Office, the National Arboretum, the National Capital Exhibition, National Electoral Education Centre, Museum of Democracy, National Gallery of Australia, Questacon, Australian Institute of Sport and the Australian War Memorial.

The cost for this excursion is \$485 per student. A deposit of \$125 is required by Friday 5 April with final payment due no later than Tuesday 23 July. Final payment can be made at any time prior to 23 July 2024. For parents who choose to pay in instalments payment is required as

below:

Deposit \$125 due Friday 5 April 2nd instalment \$120 due Thursday 2 May 3rd instalment \$120 due Monday 3 June Final payment of \$120 due Tuesday 23 July

Students will need to arrive at school on Wednesday 4 September at 7.30am for rolls to be marked, medication collected and to be ready to depart promptly at 8.00am. The estimated time of arrival back at school on Friday 6 September is 6pm.

Students who display inappropriate attitude and or behaviour prior to the excursion will have their invitation withdrawn. In such cases the deposit **ONLY** can be refunded.

Term 2- Athletics

During Term 2 every Wednesday, students will participate in a mandatory Athletics program to develop, understand and refine the skills they need to compete at their athletics carnival. The program will be run by Zing Activ who will also support our school at the Athletics Carnival.

The Athletics program is curriculum/syllabus aligned and designed to be fun whilst improving children's physical fitness as well as develop important motor skills of running, jumping and throwing. **The cost is \$37 per student.**

Activities incorporated within the program include:

• Sprinting • Middle Distance • Relays • Starting • Shot Put • Discus • Long Jump • High Jump

Zing Activ aims to create a safe and inclusive environment where students feel comfortable expressing themselves and trying new things within fitness and exercise. Students will also develop invaluable skills such as teamwork, leadership, sportsmanship, social skills and resilience - skills that are lifelong.

Personal toys at school

Some children have been bringing personal toys to school, which has not only caused issues in the playground but also in class. All students are encouraged to leave their favourite toys at home to avoid being upset when it is lost or broken.

If toys are coming to school for news, please ensure your child understands that it must stay in their bag after they have shared it with the class. If you give your child permission to play with their toy at lunch time and recess, you acknowledge that we take no responsible for what may happen to it.



Students who disregard teacher instructions and bring toys into the classroom, they will be taken from them to ensure they are focusing on learning. At the end of the day the toy will be returned for them to take home. If the issue continues to interrupt their learning and that of others, Mrs Curtis will keep the toy in her office until she decides it can be returned. Further disobedience will then be dealt with a time out.

We ask that you ensure that your child is aware that there is a time and place for learning and a time for play.

EDUCATION NEWS Attendance Matters

When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier, and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

Parents and carers can help foster positive attendance habits by:

- helping their child learn the importance of punctuality and routine.
- ensuring their child arrives on time from the start of the school day, ready to participate in learning.
- reducing disruption to learning where possible, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time
- promptly communicating any absence to the school (within 7 days of the first day of any absence)
- working with the school to encourage and support regular attendance.

Our attendance program 'A Team' is designed to reward students who attend school 90% of the time. The way to achieve this is by making sure your child:

- attends school every day.
- produce an absence note when your child is away, with justified reasons. This means unauthorised days off for holidays, shopping trips and birthdays will not be a justified reason.
- understands why they will miss out on the A team reward if their attendance is below 90%
- sees and hears you supporting and respecting school rules and decisions.
- works for rewards, regardless of their age.
- Shows respect for their teachers and friends.

Encouraging regular attendance is a core school responsibility, including:

- providing clear information to students and parents regarding attendance requirements and the consequences of unsatisfactory attendance.
- ensuring the school has effective measures in place to monitor and follow up student absences.
- ensuring school staff, including new staff and casual teachers, are provided with information on attendance requirements and their obligation to monitor and promote regular attendance at school.
- ensuring Child Protection requirements are adhered to for any matter relating to school attendance where safety, welfare or wellbeing concerns arise for any student.

Together we can ensure your child has the best access to opportunities, friendships and rewards by making sure they attend school every day, unless they are sick.

PBL

The benefits of PBL and its framework evidence base

Schools that implement PBL with fidelity improve school climate, the social emotional competence and academic success of students and teacher health and wellbeing.



The PBL framework is supported by decades of research conducted nationally and internationally. This research confirms the positive impact the PBL systems and practices have on improving student outcomes. Glossodia PS has had this program in place for 10 years. We focus on positive behaviour in and out of the classroom, individuals, small groups and whole school.

Every week a new PBL focus is discussed in class and at our after-lunch assembly. All students are encouraged to follow the expectations and are reminded of what they mean. Sometimes, students who repeatedly don't follow the expectations spend time in the 'time out' room, where teachers talk to them about what their actions and how they might approach a situation next time in a positive manner, aligning with school expectations.

Our approach is to teach students what the right behaviours are to become safe, respectful and responsible learners.

Support at home with these expectations, means that we all work together to help students become the best version of themselves. In every newsletter, we will include the PBL focus for the current week and the week following week. We would encourage you to discuss and support the PBL focus at home.

Homework

Homework in NSW schools are purposeful and designed to meet specific learning goals, build on existing knowledge, skills and understanding developed in class".

At Glossodia Public School we ask all parents to support homework practises as we believe it will:

- Ensure students can practise what they have learned in class
- determine student's understanding of lesson content and/or skills and
- help children become responsible and confident in their skills while developing good routine habits.



Whilst we all might have personal views on the importance of homework, I encourage you to think about the opportunities that will open for your children when they can complete a range of tasks with confidence. Most things we do in life require practise. Learning to play sport, an instrument, interact positively with others, drive a car, cook, dance, sing, cut hair, fix a car, build a house, design landscapes, wire up much needed air conditioning, ensuring water flows from our taps and the list goes on.

Your support is crucial in shaping good habits for future expectations at school and life. However, if you **DO NOT** want your child to do homework, please contact your child's class teacher.



Attendance 'A Team' Our Exclusive Attendance Club'

In 2022 we introduced our A team attendance club. To support families become familiar with the Department of Education's 90% attendance target, we started the 'A Team' initiative. To ensure students did not miss out, teachers contacted parents a number of times to chase up absence notes allowing all students to be rewarded. Now it is time for everyone to put processes in place to ensure absence notes are returned on time. SchoolBytes is set up for parents to submit these digitally if they prefer. ONLY students who return notes on time, with a justified explanation will be granted 'A Team' status. Every term, students are allowed 2 days off school with a note from their parent to qualify for the 'A Team' reward. After 2 days off school due to illness, a doctor's certificate MUST be presented to maintain the 'A Team' status. Considering the Department of Education's Attendance Policy indicates a 90% attendance, which includes sick days and leave, we are very lenient towards unexpected illness and events. Also, please remember that when you are going on leave for more than 5 days, you MUST fill in the Extended Leave form request from the Department of Education, to let us know where your child is during the school term. This can be collected from the office. If you DO NOT fill in this form, your child will be marked as absent with an unjustified reason. Staff have been instructed NOT to chase ANY notes from this year, so please be on top of things. WE DO NOT want your child to miss out so, please be organised. Absences can be submitted via School Bytes. Additionally, paper copy notes have been provided to your child.

Our Rewards each term for students who achieve 90% attendance and therefore, become an exclusive member of our 'A Team' are:

Term 1: Frozen choc covered bananas.

Term 2: Olympic Challenge Term 3: Class Cooking

Term 4: Movies or Raging Waters

Please note these may change but we will make sure you are aware.



Crunch & Sip

All students are encouraged to bring fresh fruit or vegetables to eat during 'Crunch & Sip'. Crunch & Sip is a set time in primary schools for students to 'refuel' on vegetables and fruit while 'rehydrate' with water. Students who are not hungry and are well hydrated perform better in the classroom, show increased concentration, and are less likely to be irritable and disruptive.

Many students are not eating enough vegetables and fruit or keeping sufficiently hydrated. Each school can choose a suitable time and way to implement Crunch & Sip that fits with the school's timetable. It may suit the school for all classes to have Crunch & Sip at the same time, or for individual teachers to decide when it best suits their class schedule. Teachers may have Crunch & Sip time while students continue on with their work or stop work and hold a Crunch & Sip specific activity inside or outside of the classroom.



Colour Run Fundraiser

Our Colour Explosion Fun Run will be on **Friday April 12**. Parents are welcome to attend with their children. If siblings and parents would like to attend and join in on the fun, it will be a small gold coin donation.

How Do You Fundraise?
